- Welcomed two new Board Members at the 2021 AGM: Simone Blais and Ida Hearder.
- Secured ongoing funding through the Provincial Services Health Authority to continue year three of the Healthy Care Pregnancy Program Piot Project and to continue to create and disseminate supports, training, guidelines and resources for helping professionals and peers who support pregnant people using substances.
- Offered and completed the 2021-22 BCAPOP Nutrition Program, funded by the Quesnel Child Development Centre and in partnership with Vitamin Angels and Natural Factors.
- Continued to adapt the current programs and services offered by the organization in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Planned and delivered numerous virtual continuing education opportunities in response to the pandemic including webinars, virtual check-ins, trainings, and virtual conferences.
- Created, approved, and implemented a budget for 2021-22 that was focused on the long-term financial sustainability of BCAPOP.

1. Basis of accounting

The basis of accounting applied in the preparation of the statement of financial position of B.C. Association of Pregnancy Outreach Programs as at March 31, 2022, and the statements of changes in net assets and revenues and expenditures for the year then ended is on the historical cost basis and reflects cash transactions with the addition of:

- accounts receivable for unpaid invoices and GST rebate
- accounts payable and accrued liabilities
- deferral of restricted income to match when funds are spent
- deferral of membership fees to match period it is related to

2. Purpose of association

The B.C. Association of Pregnancy Outreach Programs (BCAPOP) was incorporated provincially under the Society Act of B.C. on March 12, 1996. On April 9, 2020 the association was granted charitable organization status with the Canada Revenue Agency. The association is exempt from the payment of income tax under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

4. Disclosure of remuneration

As required by the Society Act of British Columbia, remuneration above \$75,000 paid to directors, employees and contractors must be disclosed.
